

## DAISY CHAIN BRACELET



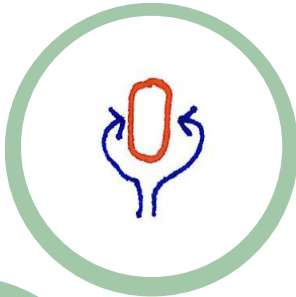

### Materials

- 5 ft. of Fishing line
- 1 Clasp
- 1 Jump ring
- White beads
- Green Beads
- Yellow Beads

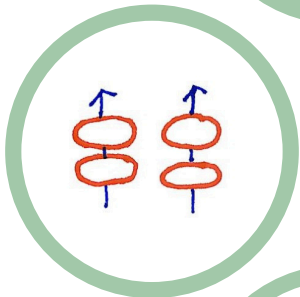
### 1 Clasp and first beads

- Fold the fishing line in half and put the clasp in the middle. Loop one end of fishing line through the clasp again to secure it in place.
- Put both ends of fishing line through 2 green beads.



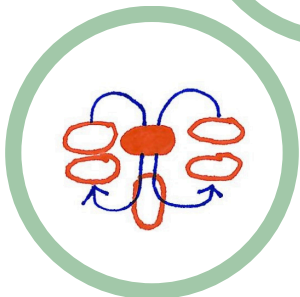
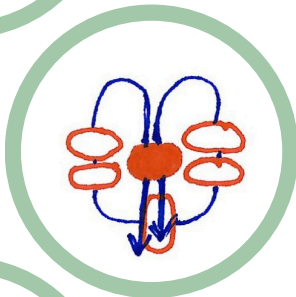
### 2 Making the flowers

- Put one white bead on one end of the line. Pass the other end of the line through the opposite side of the same bead. See the first drawing. Pull on both ends of the line to cinch up the bracelet.
- Put 2 white beads on each line.
- Put both lines through a yellow bead going the same direction.



### 3 Placing the center bead

- Take the 2 ends of the line and fold it back down toward the first beads. See drawing.
- Pinch the center yellow bead and the lines with your nondominant hand.
- Pass the line on the left back up through the 2 white beads on the left.
- Pass the line on the right back up through the 2 white beads on the right.



#### 4 Final flower petal

- Put one white bead on one end of line. Pass the other end through this bead in the opposite direction.
- Pull both ends to secure the flower.

#### 5 Leaves

Put one green bead on each side of the line.



#### 6 Flowers

Repeat steps 2-5 until the bracelet is the desired length.

Bracelets are usually 6.5 - 7.5 inches long including the clasp.

#### 7 Finishing bracelet

- Put the last 2 green beads on both ends of the line at same time.
- Pass the lines through the ring and pull close to the beads.
- Pass the lines through the ring a second time.
- Pass the lines back down through the last 2 green beads.
- Tie a knot to the line already between the beads. Pull the knot tight.
- Pass the ends of the lines through a couple of the white petal beads.
- Trim the ends of the line close to the beads. The ends of the line should be hidden inside the beads.
