2023 Highlights-Winter

The winter cold was made warmer by the efforts of local crafters who knitted, crocheted, and stitched hats for the Stitch Against the Cold project. Hats were free to anyone in need, with hundreds of handcrafted hats given away. The hat theme continued with Hat Not Hate, an anti-bullying campaign that gave blue hats to students along with messages of kindness.

MPL employees Tenisha Harris and Katherine Mitchell earned Notary Public Certifications to offer notary services at no charge, as a community service. These services are offered by appointment at Connection Corner and Maring-Hunt Library.

MPL programming throughout 2023 included zine (pronounced as zeen) workshops that guided participants in creating their own small magazines, story times, book clubs, Wild & Wacky Science, and more.

2023 Highlights-Spring

MPL participated in the annual Neighborhood I.D.E.A. Conference hosted by Muncie Action Plan and held at Ball State University. MPL Youth Services, Great Achievers, and Ready Readers employees discussed the importance of early literacy. MPL also hosted an information table at the event.

Muncie Public Library was named a Growing Home™ Certified Habitat by the Red-tail Land Conservancy for the Maring-Hunt Library Gardens. The certification means the space has all of the essentials for wildlife to thrive: food, water, cover, and a place to raise young.

The MH Gardens have been a partnership project from the start. All of the elements of the space were made possible by working together with Ball State University, Lowe's Community Grants, the 8twelve Coalition, Habitat for Humanity, the Thomas Park Avondale Neighborhood Association, the Urban Gardening Coalition, the Sherman & Marjorie Zeigler Foundation, and many others.

The most recent addition to the space is a story walk that opened in 2022, made possible by the Zeigler Foundation. The walk features the pages of a children's book that can be read while walking from post to post along the path.

2023 Highlights-Summer

The Summer Reading Program (SRP) was held in June and July to encourage everyone to keep reading throughout the summer. MPL hosted a Mud Mayhem Party to kick off Nature Play Days in partnership with the Indiana Children and Nature Network.

MPL worked closely with the City of Muncie Parks Department Summer Mentor and Employment program and with TeenWorks to provide work and learning opportunities for teens. The staff at Carnegie helped TeenWorks students learn about genealogy and research.

MPL was a proud sponsor of the Hoosier Shakespeare Festival at Minnetrista, where we distributed books from our MPL book bike.

Focus on Indiana Library Federation Statehouse Day

Each year, MPL staff attend the annual Indiana Library Federation (ILF) Statehouse Day. Library employees, board members, and advocates from across Indiana gather to demonstrate the important role that public libraries have in their communities.

Attendees gather at the Indiana State Library in the morning for a short training session, are given group assignments, and then walk to the statehouse with packets of information to present to assigned legislators. When not meeting with legislators, participants observe committee meetings, legislative sessions, or tour the statehouse. The ILF also hosts a display at the statehouse to share the role of today's libraries with the policymakers, their legislative assistants, and other visitors to the statehouse.

Muncie Public Library leadership encourages attendance at the ILF Statehouse Day to not only share the role of libraries with lawmakers, but to also help MPL employees see the significance of the work being done by libraries to help build better communities.

MPL recognizes the value of this annual exchange of ideas with legislators, and we were extremely pleased to see that our lawmakers also celebrate the opportunities that the day presents, as evidenced by State Representative Sue Errington featuring photos from ILF Statehouse Day in a legislative update.


